Busy ideas 1: This sheet will be your first ideas its called busy ideas as the page will look very busy when completed. At least 6 minimum ideas with information on sizes, materials, how you will make it, tools you could use, potential problems, include annotations and evaluations. On this sheet you should consider:

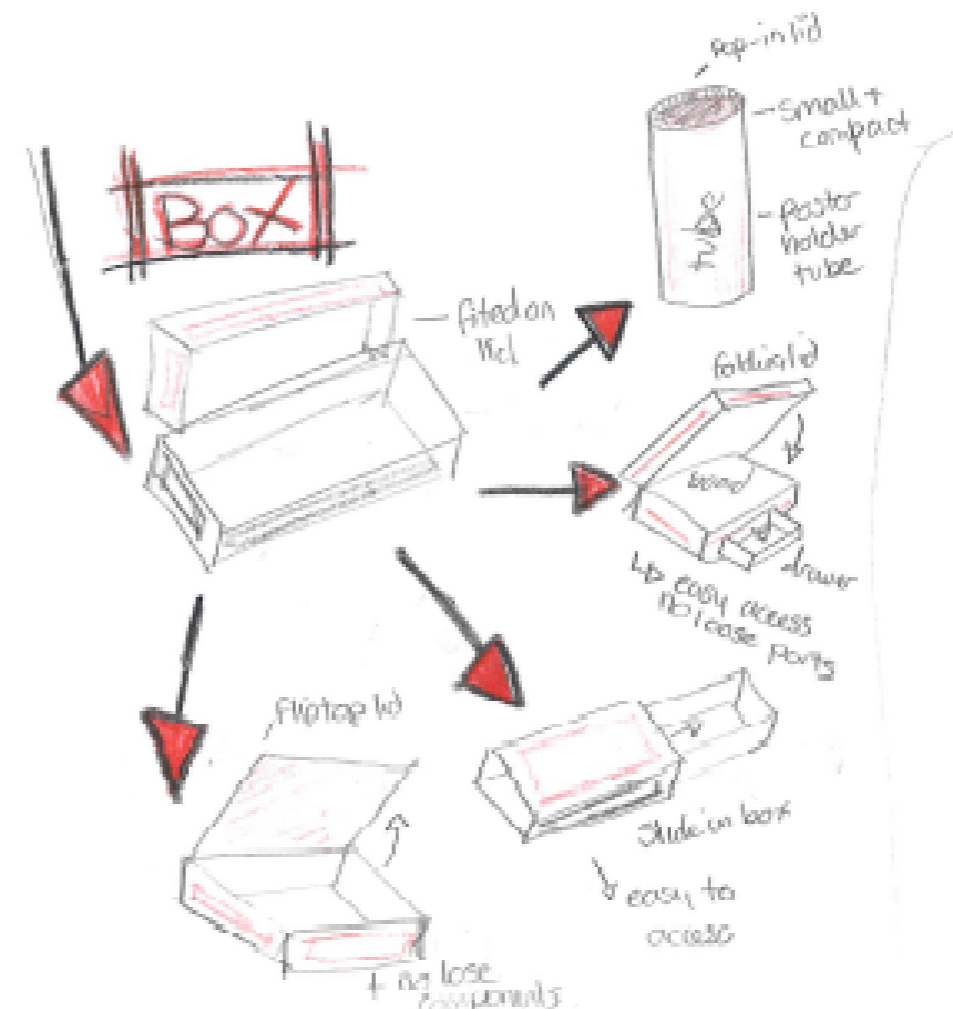
- o Quickly drawn ideas.
- o Develop the same idea on the same sheet showing the different improvements and stages.
- o Ensure your ideas are all 'DIFFERENT' ensure they are not too similar.
- o You will need to present a range of realistic and imaginative design ideas to achieve the highest marks.
- o This area of your coursework is worth approximately 3 times more than your research section.
- o You could develop each idea on the same sheet changing shape, colour, style, font, etc.
- o Do you think it will sell?
- o Does it look attractive, is it colourful and eye catching?
- o Does it fulfill its function?
- o How much will it cost?
- o How will you make it, what materials and tools will you use?
- o Does the style suit the user group?

Note: A good range of different ideas averages around six ideas.
